

Frequently Asked Recital Questions:

Do dancers need tickets?

-No, dancers do not need a ticket, unless they plan on sitting in the audience & watching most of the show. Most dancers do not have time to be in the audience, as they have dances to perform.

Do I need a ticket? I'm a dance mom.

-Yes, you do if you plan to watch from the audience. If you are going to be in the dressing room the whole time, then no.

Can we leave after my child's last dance?

-Yes, you do not have to stay until the end, unless your child wishes to take a final bow at the "Curtain Call."

Do we have to wear costumes for dress rehearsal?

-Yes, that is why it is called dress rehearsal. You must have all costumes, tights, shoes, makeup, & hair done.

Can I stand backstage to watch my child perform?

-No, we keep the backstage area cleared for safety reasons & to keep the show running in a timely fashion. Please watch your child(ren) perform from the audience.

Can I take my child from the front of the stage when they are done with their dance?

-No, all dancers will be escorted back to their dressing rooms where moms can come get them.

Do I have to pay for my 2 yr old?

-If the child will be occupying a seat, yes. If said child is sitting on a parent's lap, no.

How do I find the dressing room?

-Dressing rooms are clearly marked with neon paper. When entering Norwin High School through the entrance near the auditorium, you will walk towards the cafeteria & make a left. Walk past the auditorium & head down the ramp or stairs, then left to where the dressing rooms are. (Boys will dress in teacher locker room to the right of the ramp/stairs.). This is the only way to access the dressing rooms from public areas.

Can I leave all of my belongings in the dressing room after dress rehearsal?

-We do not recommend leaving anything since we have 2 shows & 2 dress rehearsals for separate sets of dancers using these rooms. **DJS is not responsible for belongings left behind.*

Can my dancer watch from the audience in costume?

-Dancers may wear costumes in the auditorium & watch anything they want during Dress Rehearsal. On recital day, costumes should be kept covered in public areas. We like to let them be a surprise for the audience when they take the stage.
